What is Title 1?

Title 1 started in 1965 and is the largest federal aid program to help our Nation's Schools. Grant receives federal funding to increase academic achievement in our school including additional teachers, paraprofessionals, academic materials and family engagement needs.

What is the school-parent compact?

The compact states the commitment of responsibilities for students, teachers and parents. This district document encourages parent input and suggestions. Grant Elementary compacts are shared and signed during parent-teacher fall conferences.

What is the School Improvement Plan?

Continuous School Improvement means we work to provide ongoing adjustments and improvements to help students succeed at Grant. We identify ways to provide assistance and intervention (often called title support) to students, professional development for staff, and overall increased learning time for students.

What are Parent Rights?

Parents have the right to request teacher and paraprofessional qualifications, academic training, curriculum used, as well as district and state test information. Parents have the right to become involved and informed in their child's education.

What are Family Engagement opportunities at Grant?

Grant provides opportunities for parent/family participation and to encourage educational success in the following ways: Open House Night, Parent Teacher Conferences, Parent Teacher Organization meetings, One Book One School, Prime Time Reading Nights and Read Across America Night.

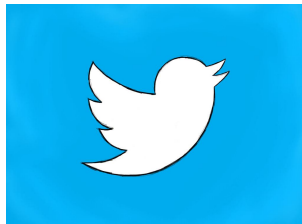
